Marcus talks about his job interview

- It went well. If you have any questions, feel free to reach out later.

Nele reports on the finances

- The budget plan, which was approved at the last meeting, has been submitted to the university leadership. Hopefully, it will be approved by March 31 and then published on April 1. Nele points out that the timeline is very tight, but we remain optimistic for now.

Willi reports on the KTS meeting

- The chief delegates and deputy delegates to the Administrative Board were elected through a very complex voting process. This was followed by the election of the spokespersons; unfortunately, there was only one candidate. The candidate was elected. A delegation was also sent to the State Science Conference.
- A workshop discussion on university funding took place, but the participants were all in strong disagreement regarding the content and outcome of the discussion.
- There were attacks on international students using rubber bullets in Ilmenau, and cooperation with the BAS was strengthened.
- **Willi** mentions that one university is currently experimenting with allowing students to pay their tuition fees in installments. **Niklas** asks how exactly this works and whether the relevant partners (student services, etc.) have complained about it. **Marcus** responds that this would already be possible under self-administration here as well, since it's possible to make multiple payments over the course of the semester and then reconcile them with the target balance. Everyone present agrees that this isn't really the same thing. **Kat** points out that this "advance payment" isn't even feasible on a consistent basis, since the necessary information isn't received until the registration period begins, leaving at most three (more likely two) months over which the payment can be spread.

Levke is asking for updates on SR309

- A group has complained to Levke that they have not received the key to the room on several occasions.
- **Klara** explains the problem: The group had only had one person added to the key list, and that person was absent on several occasions. As a result, the guard was unable to hand out the key, since the only people asking for it were those not on the list. Since the group had also met with the board in recent days, Klara had already told them to add several people to the list. They then submitted another name to the board, which will now also be added to the key list.
- **Levke** thanks everyone for the information and asks if there are any other new rules regarding the room.

- **Klara** says that there are currently no new regulations in place. She mentions that the Executive Board attempted to speak with the individuals who had recently used room 309 without prior consultation (see the report from the last StuCo meeting). In this regard, Klara had asked the security guard to direct these individuals to the StuCo office when they returned a key. However, no conversation took place because the person “ran away” through the back door shortly before reaching the StuCo office. We, too, were very confused by these events.

Klara reports from the executive board

- On March 5, we will once again be meeting with Department 4 to discuss the Frei(t)raum project. We’ll keep you updated on how things go. Due to an internship, it’s not yet clear who will be attending.
- At the last FSR-Communication meeting, the change to the locking system at the Seidelstraße dormitory was discussed. The main criticism centered on how communication with the students had been handled. We have since received feedback from Mr. Schubert on this matter; a joint meeting is expected to take place in late March or early April. We have already been assured of initial improvements in the implementation (staff training, extension of the time frame, and “professionalization” of the system’s appearance).
- We have received an invitation to participate in the 29th International Democratic, Anti-Imperialist, and Anti-Fascist Youth Camp 2026, which will take place from July 31 to August 9, 2026. If you’re interested, please feel free to contact us.
- **Katharina** asks which internship Klara will be attending soon. **Klara** replies that it is the three-week internship on *Morphology and Evolution of Craniata*.

Point of Order from Kat: Opinion Gathering: Who would prefer to give up and call it off, and who would instead prefer to adjourn the meeting, declare a suspended mandate during the break, and then hopefully have a quorum?

Determination of a quorum

- Of the **35** elected MoStuCo members, **09** have suspended their mandates. This leaves **26** MoStuCo members eligible to vote.
- A quorum is reached when **14** MdStuRa members eligible to vote are present. A two-thirds majority is achieved with **18** yes votes from the voting MoStuCo members present.
- There are **13** voting MoStuCo members present; the body is therefore **not quorate**. A two-thirds majority is **not possible**.
